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## **EDUCATION – EARLY EDUCATION**

### NAME: CENTRAL JERSEY FAMILY HEALTH CONSORTIUM (CJFHC)

**ABOUT:** Nonprofit organization dedicated to improving maternal and child health through advocacy, education, and collaboration.

**PROGRAM:** Mid-Jersey CARES is a part of the Central Jersey Family Health Consortium (CJFHC) and coordinates Early Intervention services.

**WHAT IT DOES:** Early Intervention (EI) is a statewide program that provides services and support for infants and toddlers (birth to 3 years old) with developmental delays. It focuses on helping children develop essential skills through therapies and interventions, including:

- Speech therapy for delayed speech or difficulty forming short sentences
- Physical and occupational therapy for delayed walking or fine motor skill development
- Social-emotional support for challenges with social skills, such as sharing and engaging with others

### **ELIGIBILITY:**

- Infants and toddlers (birth to 3 years old)
- Must exhibit developmental delays in areas such as speech, motor skills, or social interaction
- Evaluations are conducted to determine eligibility based on statespecific criteria

**NOTE:** Before making a referral on behalf of a child/family make sure that they know about the referral prior to completing and submitting the form.

#### NAME: ELITE YOUTH PROGRAM

**ABOUT:** The ELITE Youth Program by Middlesex County Workforce Development supports at-risk youth with job training and career guidance. It connects participants to One-Stop Career Centers and the SkillUp Middlesex platform for online training, helping them build successful futures.

#### **SERVICES:**

The program supports young people by offering:

- Career Counseling & Job Placement
- Internship for Work Experience
- English as a Second Language (ESL) Classes
- Computer Skills Training
- High School Equivalency (HSE/GED) Prep
- Job Skills & Occupational Training

#### **ADDITIONAL SUPPORT:**

- Financial literacy & life skills training
- Assistance with certification & licensing
- Access to virtual learning & professional development

#### **ELIGIBILITY:**

Youth must be:

- 16-24 years old
- Out of school

## AND meet at least one of the following:

- Homeless
- In foster care
- Have a disability
- Low-income with a barrier
- Justice-involved (juvenile or adult system)
- Pregnant or parenting

#### **NON-CREDIT SCHOLARSHIPS**


Scholarships are available for individuals seeking job training or new skills through Workforce Development & Lifelong Learning (WDLL) programs.
